Digkids - The use of touchscreens by children up to 6 years old

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CALL FOR PAPERS

We live in a society in which digital technologies (DT) are profoundly integrated in our daily lives. Thus, children are being born into homes where computers, smartphones and tablets proliferate, and they are coming into contact with these devices at increasingly younger ages.

Some view DT as harmful, considering that they are turning children into passive consumers, while others argue that we live in a digital world and that we should adopt these technologies to support the learning and the development of children. DT should be acknowledged as an important part of the daily life of children, now and increasingly in the future. We believe that is necessary for the community of academics, practitioners and for the society in general to discuss this topic and to reflect upon ways of using DT which are beneficial for younger children. The solution is not banishing technologies from their lives, but rather teaching them how to use them safely and in a balanced way, promoting their wellbeing. This aim can be accomplished through an agenda that offers guidance, and that should be developed and discussed by researchers, early childhood professionals and teachers, presenting a critical, creative and balanced perspective about how DT should be used in the first years.

With this eBook we intend to introduce theoretical concepts, research and good practices related to the use of digital technologies with children up to 6 years old, with special emphasis on children 0-3 years old.

Author guidelines:

Authors must submit a chapter up to 8000 words. The chapter must consist of:

- Title;
- Name(s) of the (s) author(s) and institution(s) to which they belong;
- Postal addresses;
- Contacts;
- Abstract (about 100-200 words);
- Five keywords;
- Full text (introduction, methodology, results, discussion, references).

The text must be presented in Times New Roman, size 12.

Titles and subtitles must be in bold. APA standards should be used.

The accepted languages are Portuguese and English.

Articles must be sent to the email address pdias@ucp.pt

After receiving the articles, they will be selected taking into account the purpose of the eBook and its relevance. The selected articles will be subject to peer review. Later they will be sent to the authors, for corrections. After corrections, they should be sent again to pdias@ucp.pt for later publication.
